

**UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA

ACADEMIC ORTHOPAEDIC SPORTS MEDICINE ASSISTANT PROFESSOR**

The Department of Orthopaedic Surgery at the University of Virginia is seeking candidates for a tenure eligible Assistant Professor position to start September 2022. This clinical faculty position is responsible for providing exceptional patient care in the management of orthopaedic sports medicine with a commitment to musculoskeletal research. Qualified applicants must have demonstrated clinical expertise and the ability to perform quality basic scientific or clinical research. Candidates must have an MD and be board-eligible or board-certified. A fellowship in the sub-specialty of Sports Medicine is expected as well as evidence of academic productivity. Salary and tenure status are dependent upon qualifications. The position will remain open until filled.

The Sports Medicine Division currently has five surgeons, three physician assistants, and three sports medicine fellows to manage the patient population. Training and exposure in the broad range of surgical techniques is preferable, particularly as it relates to hip arthroscopy, knee and shoulder reconstruction, and care of injured athletes. Research will be supported by a team of 2 Athletic Trainer-research assistants plus a PhD research director for orthopaedic clinical trials research. Opportunities for coverage of high school and college athletic teams will be a key part of the position, with a primary role at James Madison University and potentially a support role at the University of Virginia.

The selected candidate will join a group of 30 orthopaedic faculty who share emergency call coverage at a Level 1 quaternary care trauma center. The candidate will see patients in our newly constructed UVA Orthopaedic Center Ivy Road, a 200,000 square foot facility housing all adult orthopaedic subspecialties, physical therapy, operating rooms, conference space, prosthetics and orthotics, and a sports medicine center within it for both orthopaedic and primary care sports medicine and concussion care. The candidate will perform surgery in both the in-patient and the out-patient areas of the UVA Health System. Charlottesville as a university town offers a unique combination of natural beauty, rich history, cultural attractions and close proximity to a national park and the nation's capital.

Minimum Requirements

Education: Candidates must have an MD and be board-eligible or board-certified. A fellowship in the sub-specialty of Sports Medicine is expected as well as evidence of academic productivity.

Experience:

- Qualified applicants must have demonstrated clinical expertise and have demonstrated the ability to perform quality basic scientific or clinical research.
- A fellowship in Orthopaedic Sports Medicine is expected.
- Evidence of academic productivity is expected.
- Training and exposure in the broad range of surgical techniques is preferable, particularly as it relates to hip arthroscopy, knee and shoulder reconstruction, and care of injured athletes.

Licensure: Candidates must be licensed to practice medicine in the State of Virginia and be board-eligible or board-certified.
